


I Am Going To The Monument Aux Morts!

The Monument Aux Morts is a famous arch in Constantine, Algeria. It is on a cliff up above the city.




The monument is a memorial to people who fought and died in World War I. Let's go visit the Monument Aux Morts!

The front of Monument Aux Mort looks out over the city. There is a terrace in front that gives you a beautiful view




Do not play on the railings. That is not safe.

You can look down on the city and the valley from Monument Aux Morts. People come from all over to look at the memorial and enjoy this view.




It can be very warm in Constantine. Maybe you should bring a bottle of water with you!
